"They were 2-3 deep at every position. Look for them to repeat the title run this year," predicts Pereira.

The 6-0 victory over Warren Wilson College was the culmination of a profitable weekend for the Monarch women. Pereira could see that his team has "progressed nicely into the game of soccer."

Scoring for the Methodist team was done by Quinones (2), Addison (2), Salvasy (1), and Brust (1).

All-Tournament selections from Methodist were Robin Baxley, senior goalie from Tar Heel, NC, and Brenda McKimens for "strong defense" and Quinones and Brust for "finishing up well."

The Monarchs open their home season against NC Wesleyan on Tuesday, Sept. 18 at 4:00 pm.

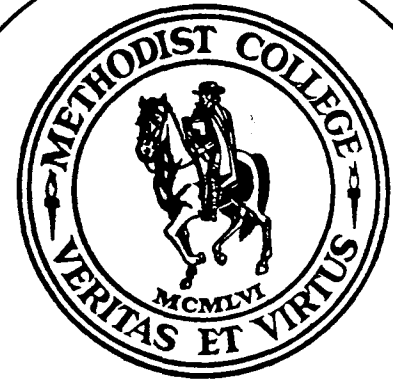

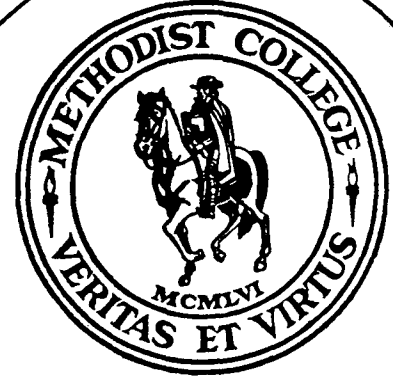

The new special services program is funded under a Title IV grant provided by the higher Education Act of 1965. Assisting Eaglin is Jan Anderson, a full-time professional counselor from Washington, GA.

The program is designed to provide academic support.

"We evaluate each student individually. Any interested student should come by our office so we can see if he meets the criteria," Eaglin said.

In addition to the counseling and support provided by Eaglin and Anderson, eleven Methodist College juniors and seniors will be chosen as salaried peer tutors for the qualifying students. Eaglin estimates that each student seeking academic support will study with his peer tutor or Anderson per week.

A major goal of the Title IV Special Services Program is to affect the retention rate at post-secondary institutions. Eaglin specifically wants to lower Methodist College's attrition rate by aiming the program at current freshmen in hopes of keeping them enrolled four years.

Anderson's services will extend beyond academic counseling. She plans to arrange workshops throughout the school year as well as provide tests, designed as counseling tools, for the program students. "These Methodist programs will help me find out more about the students' study skills, interests and problems," explained Anderson.

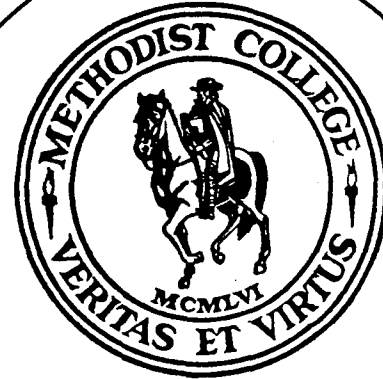

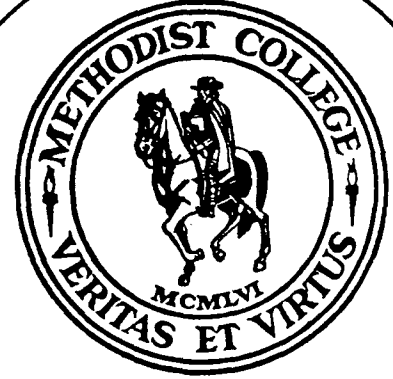

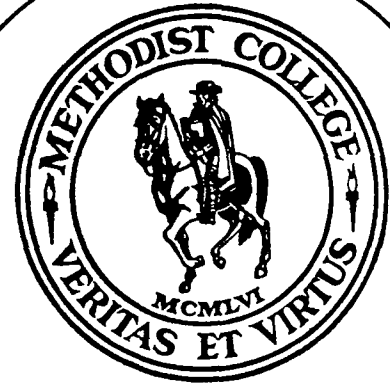
