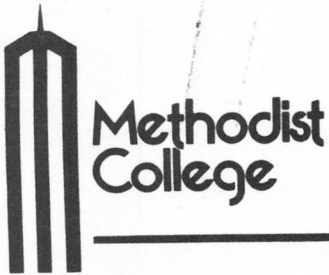

METHODIST COLLEGE TO PRESENT "FINIAN'S RAINBOW"

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--Methodist College will present the musical comedy "Finian's Rainbow" July 19, 20, and 21 at 8:00 p.m. in O'Hanlon Amphitheater on the college campus.

"Finian's Rainbow" is a fantasy about an Irishman, his daughter Sharon, and a leprechaun. The musical satirizes greed as practiced in America's rural South. The show features a large cast of local residents, directed by Alice Arrington, H. B. Hight, and Laura Potter.

Admission is \$6 for adults and \$2 for children and senior citizens. The rain date is Monday, July 23.

Daniel Freitas, a member of the chaplain's staff at Fort Bragg, plays the lead role of Finian. Victoria Royal plays Sharon, Finian's daughter. Jeff Poole plays Woody Mahoney, a sharecropper, and Allison Asbury plays Susan, Woody's mute sister.

"Finian's Rainbow" premiered on Broadway in 1947. Memorable songs from the show include "How Are Things In Glocca Morra?", "Look to the Rainbow", and "Old Devil Moon."

The show is based on a book by E. Y. Harburg and Fred Saidy. Burton Lane wrote the music and E. Y. Harburg wrote the lyrics.
