In the Guilford College Education Studies Department, we envision an end to out-dated, teaching techniques; our graduates are well prepared to be agents of change, focusing on creating child-centered environments that place the needs of the student learner at the forefront. Guilford students develop a repertoire of teaching approaches, enlightened but not confined by developmental perspectives; they learn to attend to the processes of learning as much as the quality of their students' products and performance.

In both our coursework and our field placements, we recognize that in order to become agents of change, teachers must assume the role of active ethnographers within the classroom or school, acknowledging that finding the “right” way to teach must be based on careful observation, inquiry, and analysis of context.

All students do a cross-cultural education internship, usually during a semester abroad. Internship locations have included Japan, London, Ghana, China, Italy and various locations throughout the United States. Locally, students have opportunities to work Hispanic, Montagnard-Dega and other populations. Our students come to understand themselves as global citizens who must seek insight into all cultures and voices in order to meet the needs of diverse learners.

Every student who graduates from our program has completed at least 150 hours of internship prior to their student teaching. Public and Private school administrators comment that our graduates are among the best prepared teachers they hire. They have been cited for their intelligence, ethical behavior, creativity, community-building skills and confidence.

Shenandoah Conservatory is Virginia's - and one of the country's - premier conservatories with a faculty of more than 100 professionals in music, theatre and dance and an alumni family that takes center stage from Broadway to the concert halls of Europe.

Shenandoah Conservatory offers intense, specialized, professional training in music, theatre and dance. Students work with a faculty of active professionals as they develop artistically and intellectually for careers in the performing arts. Shenandoah Conservatory offers more than 60 degrees at the baccalaureate, masters and doctoral levels, and produces more than 300 performances each year. With the opening of its newest facilities - Ohrstrom-Bryant Theatre, Glaize Studio Theatre and Ruebush Hall - in 1998, the conservatory honors its origins as it secures its commitment to quality education and the highest level of performance in music, theatre and dance. More than 700 students are currently enrolled in baccalaureate through doctoral study.

Music students in the Symphony Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra, Wind Ensemble, Conservatory Choir, Jazz Ensemble, Cantus Singers, Chamber Choir and Shenandoah Singers have received regional and national acclaim through off-campus concerts and other invitational tour appearances. Performances include the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C. and The Music Center at Strathmore. Your professional development is further refined through solo and chamber music opportunities.

The Jazz Ensemble averages 15 performances each year in various tours, jazz festivals, conventions, artist series and concerts, and has toured Europe, China, Japan and Africa. The Shenandoah Sing-

ers have toured Brazil and Japan. The Conservatory Choir, under the direction of Grammy Award-winning conductor Robert Shafer, regularly performs with the City Choir of Washington and tours Europe in alternate years.

The conservatory is also home to Shenandoah Summer Music Theatre, a professional company that presents four professional musicals with full orchestra each summer. Current students and alumni have made up the majority of the summer theatre's actors, technical and management workers, and musicians since its inception in 1984.

The Davidson College Psychology Department strives to provide our students a world-class education, second to none, in all aspects of the discipline of psychology, now and in the future. We also strive to create and maintain a climate of daily excellence within the Department, in which our faculty may flourish in their professional growth as contributors to the field, reaching their highest level of professional attainments, supported and celebrated by their peers.

## Major Requirements

Ten courses are required including 101; 310; one seminar; and 400, 401, or 402. Two courses must be methods courses: one must be 301, 302, 303, 304, 305, or 323; and one must be 314, 315, 316, 318, or 319. Of the ten courses, students must take at least one in each of the following areas:

Cognitive/Neuroscience courses: 276, 282, 284, 295\*, 296\*, 301, 302, 303, 304, 305, 323, 324

Clinical/Developmental courses: 231, 234, 236, 241, 243, 245, 297\*, 314, 315, 319

Social/Industrial-Organizational courses: 230, 232, 254, 260, 298\*, 316, 318

The seminar requirement may not satisfy any area requirement.

In addition, all seniors must satisfactorily complete an oral interview conducted by a psychologist who is not a member of the department.
