FAYETTEVILLE--Two professors from state universities will be the featured speakers for the fourth Methodist College forum Monday (April 11) on "The South In Transition."

Monday nights forum will begin at 7:30 in the Science Building Auditorium, and is entitled "The Changing Role of Women." The public is invited, and there will be no admission charge.

Dr. Dorothy A. Gay, visiting assistant professor of American history at North Carolina State University, and Dr. Helen G. Edmonds, university distinguished professor of history at North Carolina Central University, will be the featured speakers. Panelists will include three Methodist College professors: Dr. Janet Cavano, associate professor of English; Ray Conley, assistant professor of speech; Earl Martin, associate professor of sociology; and Patricia Gray, a senior social work major from Fayetteville. Clifton Lecornu, assistant professor of sociology, will serve as moderator.

Dr. Edmonds is the author of three books, has been named "Woman of the Year" three times and has received the keys to five major cities.
