METHODIST COLLEGE CHORUS TO PERFORM IN NEW YORK AND NEW JERSEY

FAYETTEVILLE, NC--The Methodist College Chorus will embark on a mid-Atlantic concert tour March 8-12.

Director Alan Porter said the 25-member group will perform at churches in Mullica Hill, NJ; Brooklyn, NY; Roanoke Rapids, NC; and Mt. Gilead, NC. The students will have a "free day" Friday, March 10 for sightseeing in New York City.

The chorus will perform a varied program of classical, sacred, and popular music. Jane Weeks Gardiner will serve as piano accompanist for the group. "The Rainbow's End," a six-member ensemble, will also perform.
