**METHODIST COLLEGE READIES FOR FALL OPENING**

FAYETTEVILLE, NC—Methodist College opened its 35th academic year August 8, as 595 students began Fall Term I of Evening College. Another 1,155 students are expected for the regular day program which begins August 23.

New resident students will arrive Saturday, August 20, followed by continuing students August 21. Approximately 650 resident students are pre-registered; 56 have been assigned to the new women's residence hall.

If pre-registration figures hold up, Methodist will enroll approximately 1,750 students, a new record. In Fall '93, the college opened with 1,620 students—1,116 in the day program and 502 in the evening.
