| Solutions | Impact | Constraints |
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| Social media app to post events | Students can filter out activities they have no interest in such as dances or sporting events | Would need to hire someone who's in charge of maintaining the app |
| TVs in student center, residence halls, and library to advertise club activities through videos and static ads | Constant exposure and eye- catching advertising - could lead to a spike in student participation | Large capital to fund it and maintain |
| Shared Methodist University Calendar to post events | Enables students to plan weeks in advance and may increase participation | Requires club leaders to remain up to date with planned events — cancellations or date/time changes |
| Virtual bulletin board – QR codes around campus link to events and flyers | Allows to mainstream the push of information - students can scan the code and search for any "genre" of event that would interest them | Creating and maintaining a website to house all the information – word would spread quickly on how to use |
