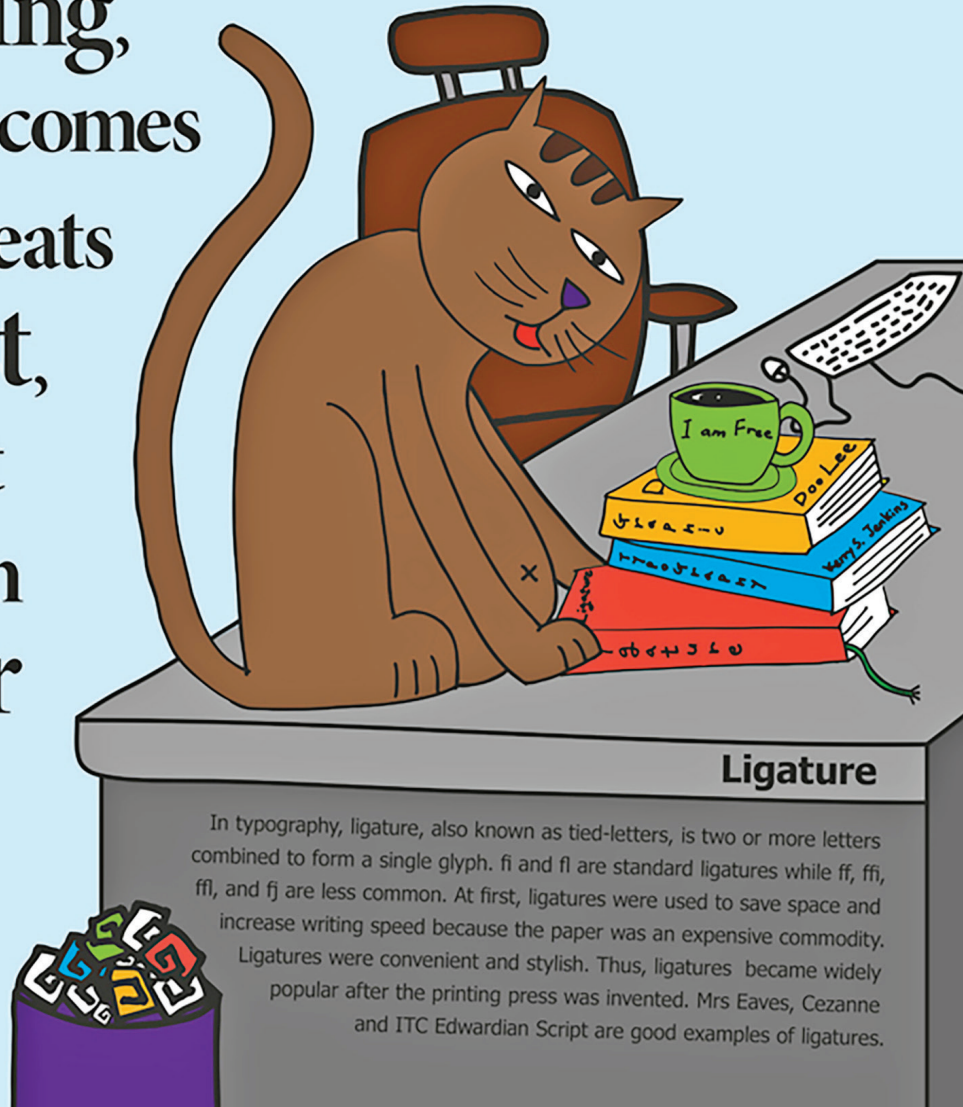


Every morning,

Ligature

In typography, ligature, also known as tied-letters, is two or more letters combined to form a single glyph. fi and fl are standard ligatures while ff, ffi, and fj are less common. At first, ligatures were used to save space and increase writing speed because the paper was an expensive commodity. Ligatures were convenient and stylish. Thus, ligatures became widely popular after the printing press was invented. Mrs Eaves, Cezanne and ITC Edwardian Script are good examples of ligatures.
