<u>The student will</u>:

- Adhere and uphold the ethical standards, policy, and procedures of AOTA, the FW site, and university (B.7.1).
- Follow universal precautions, use sound judgment to ensure safety of self and others, if asked to participate in a client's treatment (B.3.7; B.7.1).
- **Review the documentation methods**, **screening**, **and/or assessment tools** of the practice setting (B.4.4).
- **Complete a medical record review and compose one written intervention note** reflective of the FW setting that is clear, concise, and accurately contains professional and medical terminology (B.3.5; B.4.29).
- Actively assist and participate in a therapy session and/or an evaluation <u>under the direct</u> <u>supervision of the FWE (i.e. ask client interview questions; MMT & ROM; set up a therapy</u> session; fine motor, dressing, balance/functional mobility, or other occupation-based activity) (B.4.3; B.4.10).
- Ask relevant questions in regards to evaluations and/or intervention approaches, and the OT role and responsibilities (B.4.2).
- Begin to utilize effective oral competence and written communication skills with FWE and other professionals, clients, and family/care givers (e.g. discussions with supervisor, during client interactions, informal or formal professional interactions) (B.4.23; B.4.29).
- Observe an interprofessional team interaction/meeting (or if possible, observe another interprofessional treatment session/ interaction with client/family/caregiver) to better understand how to work collaboratively and respectfully as a team member (B.4.25).
- Critically analyze and discuss one client's initial and current functional performance level and how it relates with stated goals, interventions, and outcomes through observation and inquiry (B.3.5; B.4.2; B.4.3)
- Identify psychosocial factors observed in clients and the strategies/approaches utilized by the FWE to promote safety and/or engagement in interventions.
