Chapel

Weekly Chapel is the *inspiration* anchor of CIRCUIT, MU’s holistic approach to mission integration and well-being, connecting mind, body, and spirit through inspiration, education, and community. Chapel is a non-denominational worship service that provides an opportunity to grow spiritually through Biblical teaching, prayer, and song. All students, faculty, and staff are invited. This is a time at the beginning of the week when the MU community can intentionally listen for the word of God and pray for MU, Fayetteville, and the world. It is also a time when we publicly practice our commitment to pray for the many people who leave their prayer requests on prayer cards at Hensdale Chapel. All are welcome to come and pray.

SACRED SPACES ON CAMPUS

Matthews Chapel

Located at the front of campus, the Matthews Chapel is the primary Christian worship space at MU. The space also hosts functions that encourage fellowship, including receptions, dinners, recitals and theatre productions.

Hensdale Chapel

The first chapel on campus, Hensdale Chapel is a space for prayer and meditation, as well as a space for worship, classes and small religious gatherings. It is located on the Quad at the Bell Tower.
